FLYING TO MEMPHIS

SAA no longer selects official airlines, as web fares are the least expensive. To get from the airport, people generally take cabs. The average cab fare from the airport to the downtown hotels is in the range of \$30 plus charges for additional people and luggage. If you are coming in with others, that may be an economical way to go. In order to offer another option, SAA has arranged for Memphis Best Tours to offer a shuttle service for SAA meeting attendees. This shuttle service is somewhat limited and has different rules than a typical airport shuttle, as this is a special dedicated service for SAA attendees:

The repository includes documents, data sets, images, and the results of thousands of archaeological investigations. tDAR simplifies the publication and sharing of archaeological information. Using it can increase your productivity and professional visibility significantly.

In this workshop you will learn how tDAR enables you:

- to share your work with colleagues or the public without compromising confidential information;
- to more efficiently conduct background research and comparative studies;
- to ensure your reports and other work is used and cited by others;
- to more easily engage in Section 106 reviews and public engagement;
- to achieve preservation strategies for digital associated records in accordance with 36 CFR 79; and,
- to meet NSF, NEH, and other federal or grant-related data preservation requirements

Topics cover basic use of tDAR: simple and advanced searching; adding how to add and access documents, data sets,

From 1960-1972, the United States' first spy satellite program, known as CORONA, captured high-resolution (2m), stereo images of much of the world. Because CORONA preserves a picture of the landscape prior dramatic land use changes of recent decades, it often reveals archaeological sites and ancient landscape features such as roads, canals and field systems that are now obscured or destroyed. Since its declassification in 1996, a few archaeologists have used CORONA, but the spatial distortions contained in these unusual images have remained a constant challenge to more widespread applications. Over the last three years, the Center for Advanced Technologies (CAST) has developed techniques to efficiently process CORONA imagery and produce accurate, ortho-rectified digital map products. CAST is now making some 1600 images of the Near East publicly available at no cost. The workshop will teach participants techniques for processing CORONA images, how to access CAST's image data on the

web, and how these data can be used to create digital terrain models and 3D images using ArcGIS and ERDAS. The workshop will also highlight many archaeological applications for this remarkable resource. The current CAST CORONA archive is at <http://corona.cast.uark.edu>

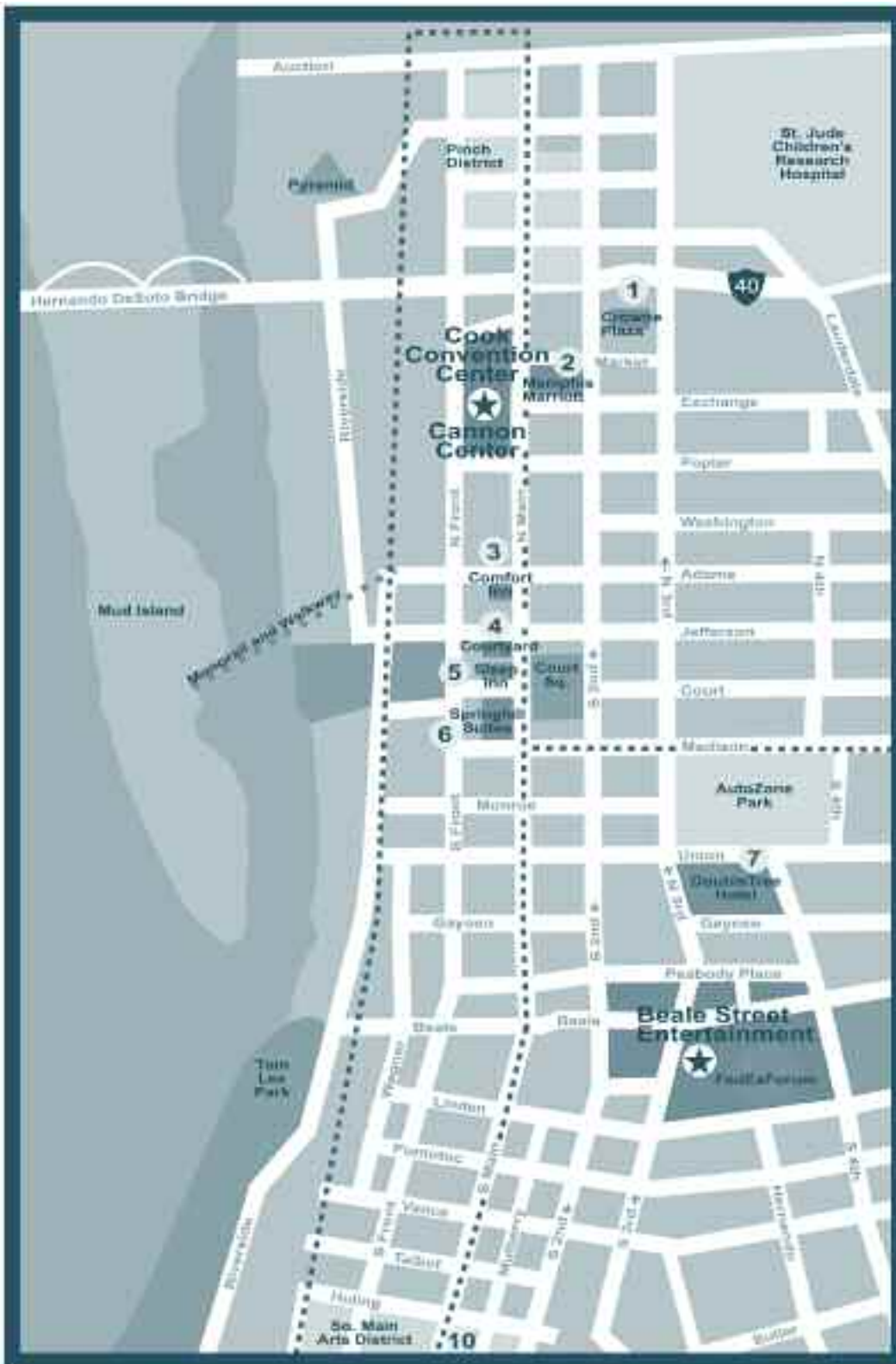
